Dear friend,

We are so glad you have come across this project, and hope you will learn and engage with us. This zine is a collaboration of artists, graphic designers, illustrators, poets (and more), from across Turtle Island, aka occupied U.S. and Mexico, North American territories, and Hawai'i. For months we have been dreaming this coloring book into creation, and we are so grateful to be able to share it with you now.

We began organizing this project in August of 2019, when the separation of children and families at the U.S./Mexico border was saturating the American news cycle. Now, in April 2020, COVID-19 dominates global headlines, but the impact on undocumented migrants is largely ignored.

ICE raids continue. Families continue to be separated at the border. Undocumented parents lose work without access to stimulus checks. Over-crowded, for-profit detention centers prevent social distancing, exposing detainees to coronavirus while denying them access to proper sanitation, food and medical care.

Now more than ever, we must support our undocumented neighbors and demand the immediate end to detention, deportation, and family separation. #FREETHEMALL.

At the end of this document is a list of financial resources for undocumented folks impacted by COVID-19, as well as readings to support all of us in educating ourselves and contextualizing these events in a long legacy of US imperialism, white supremacy, colonialism and genocide.
