Wynn Adele they/them

This artwork is in memory of Óscar Alberto Martínez Ramírez and Angie Valeria, the Salvadorian father and daughter who drowned crossing the Rio Grande river in June 2019. They are surrounded by an altar of more than 313 seeds and flowers, in honor of the 313 recorded lives stolen by the US/Mexico border the year prior. May the brutal systems that caused their deaths be dismantled swiftly and permanently, and may their lives always be remembered.

Wynn Adele organized this project with the support of many other artists. Wynn is a white queer artist and designer of Irish and Norwegian descent, who was raised in the Pacific Northwest on the unceded territories
